




How to View Advanced Data...



The 'Coastal Mapper' contains a 'Map Contents' list on the left of the screen.


The 'Map Contents' lists all maps you can use.

Maps with a 'tick' next to them are visible on the screen.



Each map has a  symbol next to it.


By clicking on the  you can see more information, and access more maps.



Some maps are 'greyed out', meaning they are too detailed to be viewed at large scales.

These maps will become available as you 'Zoom In'.

Clicking on the  symbol will also let you see the legend / colour schemes of the maps.






How to View Advanced Data...



Ticking an empty box will switch on the new maps.

Some maps are very detailed, and will not show all their information at larger scales.


You can use the **'Zoom In'** tool to look more closely at an area.




Click on the **'Zoom In'** tool and move your mouse pointer to the area you are interested in.

Left-click the mouse pointer on the location you wish to zoom in to

You can also select an area you wish to zoom in to, by holding down the left mouse button and dragging a box over the area you are interested in



You can switch of other maps if the main map screen becomes too busy by **un-ticking** the maps





How to View Advanced Data...



Some maps hold extra written information within them. This can be seen

using the  button

Move the mouse pointer over the map, and left click the pointer on the area you would like more information on




The **'Results'** box will open

Click on the  symbol next to the result

The results will list all maps with more information

available. Click on the  symbol next to the map information

Ticking the box next to the record will highlight it on the main map window




Clicking on the  symbol will disconnect the **'Results'** window, allowing you to move it around.

Clicking on the  button will return the **'Results'** window to the left hand side of the screen

Clicking on the  button will shrink the **'Results'** window

Both the **'Overview'** and **'Map Contents'** have the  an  buttons, and work in the same way





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


The 'Beach' data is our most detailed, and should only be viewed at small scales

The 'Beach' data is split bi-annually. Over time more maps will become available.

The highly detailed nature of these maps means they may take longer to appear.

It is best to look at only 1 or 2 at a time.



Choose which maps you wish to look at, by ticking the box next to it .

Switch on the maps by ticking the map group , in this case 'Beach Level Data'.

There is a range of map available on the website, including **Cliff Lines**, **Lost Villages** and **Aerial Photos**.

Some maps are more detailed than other, and may time longer to appear on the screen.
